Health services for whanau at home

BOP DHB have followed the success of other DHB's services by placing nurse led Kaupapa Maori community based services into isolated rural roopu. Mobile nurses will be visiting families in their own homes and run clinics in their respective communities. BOPDHB have currently contracted the services of six regional services charged with delivering the services.

problems associated with Maori seeking regular healthcare including distance and generally feeling more comfortable.

The services offer a "whanau Ora" perspective where the nurses care for the whole whanau on visits rather than just one patient. Community based services are due to operate in rural eastern and western Bay of Plenty.

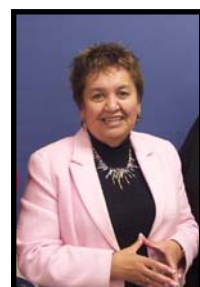
New President for Te Kaunihera O Nga Neehi Maori

Successful hui for Te Mana Wananga

The first round of consultation hui has now taken place throughout Tainui Waka with over 60 people attending the various hui to show their support and to find out how Te Mana Wananga could benefit offenders and their whanau.

At each of the Hui the feedback from the attendees supported the goals of Te Mana Wananga to have a united front to reduce offending and re-offending amongst Maori within Tainui waka, to build a network of Tohunga, therapists and maori services who work with offenders and their whanau, to gain their support as a service to refer to, to have their input into the kaupapa to benefit offenders and their whanau and to establishment a Tainui Waka Maori Focus group specifically focusing on Maori offending, Reduction and Pre-

vention within the region.

There was also a large interest in the training component of Te Mana Wananga because it is Maori, universal, practical and easy to transfer which gave the participants the assurance that the training program can work for all areas (Wahine, Tane, Whanau, Rangatahi and Kaumatua).

With the main purpose of the organisations coming together been to meet and follow through with the next step being the Evaluation & Feedback Hui which will take place on Tuesday, 2nd September 2008 in Hamilton.
